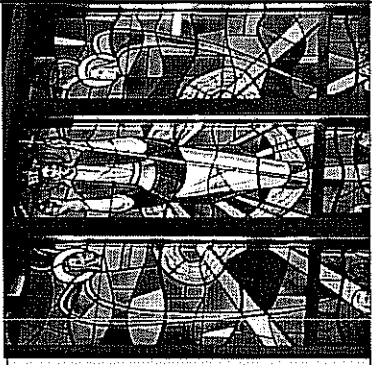

Jesus and the Garden of Gethsemane



On May 15th workers from the Willet Hauser Architectural Glass began removing the old windows just outside St. Mary's Chapel and began installing a three-panel window depicting Jesus' agony in the Garden of Gethsemane, at the foot of Mt. of Olives in Jerusalem, where on the night before his crucifixion he prayed as his disciples slept.

The window was gifted to our church by a benefactor. The congregation was also invited by the benefactor to make a contribution toward the cost of the window if they so desired.

Shortly, a plaque will be placed on the wall engraved with the names of the contributors. Once the project is completed, Fr. Doug will bless and dedicate the window. The announcement will be in our Sunday bulletin.

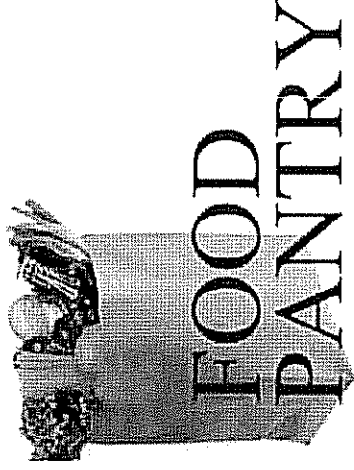


Food Pantry
